First Reading**Deuteronomy 26:1-11***(Reader: Kevin Campbell)*

When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the LORD your God that I have come into the land that the LORD swore to our ancestors to give us." When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the LORD your God, you shall make this response before the LORD your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, we cried to the LORD, the God of our ancestors; the LORD heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O LORD, have given me." You shall set it down before the LORD your God and bow down before the LORD your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the LORD your God has given to you and to your house.

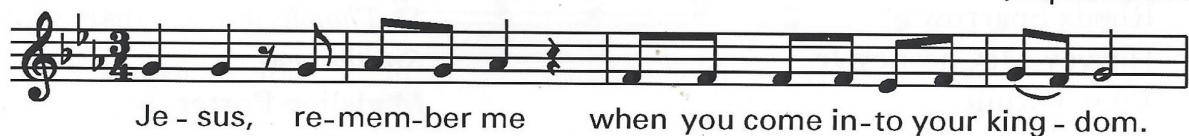

Luke 4:1-13

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

After his baptism, Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone.'" Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, "To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him.'"

On the night before he died for us, Our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, *“Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.”*(+)
After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, *“Drink this, all of you: This is my blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”* (+)

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,
We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all you Saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Monthly "Breath" Prayer

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart.

Monthly Spiritual Practice: St. Ignatius' method to meditate on Lord's Prayer:

1. Prepare yourself: Find a quiet place, calm your mind, and ask God to help you pray and understand the prayer better.

2 Meditate on each part: After reading each phrase, take a moment to reflect on its meaning. Imagine yourself in the presence of Jesus as He speaks these words. Let each word or phrase touch your heart.

- "Our Father, who art in heaven...": Focus on calling God "Father." What does it feel like to be loved by Him?

- "Hallowed be Thy name...": Think about the holiness of God's name. How do you honor God?

- "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven...": Reflect on what it means for God's will to be done. Are you open to God's plan for you?

- "Give us this day our daily bread...": Think about God providing for you. What do you need today?

- "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us...": Focus on forgiveness. Is there anyone you need to forgive? How does God forgive you?

- "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil...": Reflect on the challenges you face. Ask for God's help to stay strong and away from evil.

3. Talk to God: After each phrase, talk to God about what came to mind or what you felt. Ask Him for help or insight.

4. Close: End your prayer with gratitude, resting in God's presence.
